1	2016	Château Camarsac – Bordeaux Superieur <i>Great value Bordeaux blend (cab sauv and merlot). Nice, ripe black fruit, a hint of chocolate and a pleasant balance of ripeness and supple tannins give this plenty of appeal.</i>	33.00
2	2000	Château Langoa Barton – St Julien <i>Silky smooth in texture, fleshy, very pure towards the finish with black cherries, plum, tobacco and a touch of cassis. Long length, medium-bodied with very fine tannins and from one of the best vintages in the last 20 years.</i>	110.00
3	2014	Château Ormes de Pez – St Estephe <i>This wine is a great reason to love wines from Saint Estephe. Dark berry fruit, plum, a hint of tobacco leads the palate to beautifully long tannins and balanced acid and alcohol. Drinks well above its price point.</i>	35.00
4	2014	Château Cissac – Haut Médoc <i>Textbook Médoc with plenty of juicy, chunky blackcurrant fruit, firm tannins and fine length. Cissac's new style has good balance, and is no longer overwhelmed by tannins.</i>	29.50
5	2016	Château Montaguillon - Montagne St Emilion <i>This has a delicious supple red fruit character of plums, blackcurrants and cherries backed up by good structure and ripe tannins. Very classy and firm favourite at Gliffaes.</i>	40.00

6	2017	Bourgogne Pinot Noir – Domaine Michel Juillot <i>Light, fresh and mineraly with juicy red fruits. Very versatile red wine that goes well with most red meat dishes.</i>	39.00
7	2017	Fleurie La Bonne Dame' - Louis Tête <i>Vibrant ruby-purple colour with sweet almost jammy aromas. Dry palate but soft with bags of cherry & red berry fruit. Fine accompaniment to pork.</i>	32.00
8	2013	Vosne Romanée 1 ^{er} Cru – Clos des Réas, Michel Gros <i>Twice awarded IWC Red Wine Maker of the Year, Michel Gros makes benchmark Vosne-Romanée from a walled vineyard that has been solely owned by the Gros family since 1860. A lovely velvety wine with a core of black cherry fruit.</i>	120.00
9	2012	Monthelie "Les Crays"- Prunier-Bonheur <i>This wine has good colour, and nice fruit, beginning to develop secondary flavours and aromas from bottle age, of autumn leaves and truffles. Drinking perfectly seven years on.</i>	47.30

10	2018	Côtes du Rhône – Domaine de L'Amandine, Seguret <i>Made by my brother in one of the prettiest villages in Provence. A fresh and vibrantly fruity southern Rhône blend, spicy and smokey.</i>	29.00
11	2015	Corbières – La Sélection, Château du Vieux Parc <i>From the hot South-West of France a blend of Carignan, Syrah & Grenache taken from the winemakers best vineyards and aged in oak. A rich and full bodied red with spicy pepper and plum notes, great with rich red meat dishes.</i>	34.00
12	2016	Rasteau, 'La Bastide' - Domaine Brusset <i>Delicious mouthful of black fruits and spice, all the hallmarks of classic southern Rhône wine. Gigondas is often considered to be a baby Chateauneuf-du-Pape.</i>	38.00
13	2017	Malbec – Pigmentum, Georges Vigouroux, AC Cahors <i>Coming from the French south west the Malbec wines were called 'the black wines' in the middle ages, hence the name Pigmentum. The wine is very fruity with rich, buttery tannin on the palate. Round, attractive and inviting, it makes a fine aperitif.</i>	29.00

A delicious expression of Spain's favourite grape; juicy, fruity and a backbone of minerality. A great discovery for me.</i>	32.00
15	2013	Rioja Crianza – Hacienda El Ternero <i>I am always on the lookout for good Rioja and I have found it with this delicious one. The palate is soft with black cherries and plums combined with balsamic, liquorice, black olive and toast notes from the time spent in oak.</i>	42.50
16	2016	Susana Sempre Roble - Mallorca <i>Packed full of hot Mallorcan sun-ripened red and black fruit character, a lovely full bodied wine made from 55% Manto Negro, 30% Cabernet Sauvignon, 15% Merlot.</i>	32.00
17	2016	A Descoberta Tinto (<i>The Discovery Red</i>) – Casa de Passarella – Dao, Portugal <i>A pleasant discovery for me to, a lovely combination of three native Portuguese grape varieties from a well established cellar. A medium bodied red, elegant and balanced ripe red fruit driven wine.</i>	30.00

18	2019	Valpolicella DOC – Bertani <i>At its best, Valpolicella is one of Italy's most tempting light reds (12%). Always reminding one of cherries, right down to the bitter-almond like finish of a cherry kernel. Bertani are one of the best producers in the Veneto for Valpolicella.</i>	34.00
19	2015	Rosso di Toscana– Casa Brancaia <i>A feisty blend of Sangiovese, Merlot and Cabernet Sauvignon. A classy red with aromas of berry fruit and tea notes. Full bodied with a long finish. Almost as good as being in Tuscany.</i>	40.00
20	2018	Rosso Conero DOC – Passo del Lupo, Fazi Battaglia <i>Untamed red from central Italy, a juicy mass of wild berries and red fruits, perfumed with wildflowers. 85% Montepulciano, 15% Sangiovese. This Rosso Conero comes from vineyards on the slopes of Monte Conero, near Ancona.</i>	33.00
21	2018	Primitivo Salento, Boheme – Puglia IGP <i>Rich aromas of plum and black cherry with spicy notes of cracked black pepper. A balanced wine with a velvety texture and intense black forest and damson fruits.</i>	25.00
22	2016	Barolo – Vigna del Gris, Conterno Fantino – Monforte d'Alba <i>A very consistent producer of modern style Barolo from one of the best vineyards or 'sori' (slopes). Firm and graceful, more savoury than fruity. Great with something rich like Beef Wellington and to take through to the cheese. 100% Nebbiolo.</i>	98.00

23	2017	Merlot Reserva – Vina Leyda, Leyda Valley, Chile <i>This is a juicy, red fruit Merlot that makes for a great aperitif but will make a good companion to a Sunday lunch as well as duck and lamb at dinner. A firm Gliffaes favorite.</i>	32.00
24	2016	Estate Malbec – El Esteco, Calchaqui Valley, Argentina <i>A concentrated Malbec with notes of blueberries, dried fruits, raisins, coffee and a touch of herbaceousness. The vibrant palate has firm and juicy tannins.</i>	36.00
25	2015	Wente Zinfandel – Beyer Ranch, Livermore Valley, California <i>From the oldest family run winery in California comes this great Zinfandel with its deep jammy flavours but without being too alcoholic (13.5%). Notes of dark cherry and spices with a hint of vanilla from the ageing in neutral oak barrels.</i>	38.00
26	2015	Othello – Dominus Estate, Napa Valley, California <i>A delicious Bordeaux blend (Cab Sauv, Cab Franc & Petit Verdot) made under the watchful eye of the Moueix family. On the palate, creamy blackcurrant fruit layed with caramel and rich supple tanins. From the famed Napanook Vineyards, Yountville.</i>	65.00

27	2015	Cabernet Sauvignon - Ste. Michelle Vineyards, Columbia Valley, Washington <i>The first winery of Washington State, founded over 50 years ago. Good easy, drinking Cabernet Sauvignon that is plummy and robust enough to go well with red meats and blue cheese as well.</i>	35.00
28	2016	Long Barn Pinot Noir – Napa Valley California <i>Notes of bramble fruit and cherries combine with a subtle sweet spice character and a fresh acidity. Well structured with soft tannins and a silky mouthfeel, the fresh fruit flavours linger on the palate. A recent discovery with which I am very pleased.</i>	34.00

29	2009	Glatzer Amon-Ra Shiraz– Barossa Valley <i>The flagship wine from the famous Glatzer cellars. This shiraz needs time which is why it's been in my cellar for 10 years. Wood smoke, mineral, scorched earth, Asian spices, blueberry, and chocolate. Super-rich, dense, yet surprisingly light on its feet.</i>	80.00
30	2015	Bishop Shiraz - Glaetzer - Barossa Valley <i>Sloes, vanilla & fruit cake on the nose with liquorice, chocolate and dark fruit flavours. A gentle monster which has become highly sought after and something of a legend.</i>	46.00
31	2017	Carrick Unravelled - Pinot Noir - Central Otago, New Zealand <i>Fresh flavours of cherries and soft leather – crisp on the palate, yet surprisingly soft. Good example of the juicy, fruit-forward style of Pinot Noir that New Zealand does so well.</i>	40.00
32	2016	Chaffey Bros Wine Co – La Conquista! – South Australia <i>A fragrant Mediterranean blend of Tempranillo, Grenache & Graciano. A riot of lavender and thyme on the nose and burst of red berries in the mouth. Medium bodied.</i>	33.00

33	2014	Journey's End Estate- 'The Cape Doctor' - Stellenbosch <i>Cabernet Sauvignon driven Bordeaux blend that South African cellars pull off so well. Named after the SE wind that keep the vineyards cool. Luch, ripe and fruity with hints of spice.</i>	46.00
34	2018	Kottabos –Syrah and Grenache - Stellenbosch <i>This elegant Rhône blend displays Old World Style with New World fruit. Grenache's earthy rusticity and Shiraz's noble spice, perfect with lamb and grilled meats.</i>	30.00
35	2016	Sutherland Pinot Noir - Elgin <i>South Africa is getting very good with Pinot now, and Brian Webb is one of the best. The wine is light and clean, with earthy wild strawberry and raspberry flavours, and a perfumed and elegant finish. A good choice with lamb.</i>	40.00
36	2017	Bosstock Pinotage MAN Family Wines – Klappmuts, Stellenbosch <i>Pinotage is a cross of Pinot Noir and Cinsaut and pretty much grown only in South Africa. Deep ruby red in the glass, it's bold and juicy with red-berry fruit flavours and a touch of sweet oak spice. Deliciously moreish.</i>	26.00

Entre-Deux-Mers

- 41 2018 Château Sainte-Marie – Entre-deux-Mers 34.00
Good value and refreshing white from between the rivers Garonne & Dordogne. Perfect with seafood and salads or as an aperitif out on the terrace. Deliciously dry and crisp, a favorite of mine.

White Burgundy

- 42 2017 Pouilly-Fuissé – Domaine Guerrin & Fils 42.00
Pouilly-Fuissé remains a firm favourite, always well balanced and so versatile with all fish and white meat dishes, hot or cold.
- 43 2019 Bourgogne Chardonnay – Maison Joseph Drouhin 36.00
Fruity and lively, This is a classical white Burgundy. The colour is golden yellow, with a greenish glint. The aromas are reminiscent of fresh grapes and green almonds with an elegant texture.
- 44 2017 Chablis Vieilles Vignes – Domaine Gautheron 42.00
Traditional Chablis from old vines, fermented and matured in stainless steel vats to preserve the fresh steely flavours. It has fresh, floral aromas with notes of citrus and green apples. Well balanced, with a silky mouthfeel and a fresh acidity and a long and lingering finish.
- 45 2017 Montagny 1er Cru Les Basset - Domaine Laurent Cognard 58.00
Laurent Cognard is extremely excited about his 2017s and believes his Montagny Premier Cru Les Bassets is the best he has ever made from this particular vineyard. Fresh, semi-tropical fruit on the nose, rich, grilled and really intense, leading to a ripe, juicy palate.

Loire

- 46 2018 Muscadet sur Lie - 'Cuvée Prestige' Clos de la Fine - Domaine des Herbauges 28.50
A single vineyard bottling from a perfectionist winemaker. Perfect with fish and seafood of course.
- 47 2017 Vouvray – Clos le Vigneau – Château Gaudrelle 40.00
A classic Vouvray in the "sec-tendre" style with just the right amount of residual sugar to balance out the racy acidity of the Chenin Blanc grape. Too often overlooked, well made and delicious.
- 48 2018 Sancerre - St Gemme en Sancerrois - Domaine de la Chézatte 45.00
Sancerre is the classic French dry white that inspired the plantings of Sauvignon Blanc in New Zealand and elsewhere. Dry, crisp and with a pleasing roundness in 2009 that makes it very easy to drink.

Rhone and the South

- 49 2018 Viognier Leduc – IGP Pays d'Oc – Languedoc 28.00
Fruity yet fresh and perfumed with aromatic summer fruits such as peaches and apricots. A light wine at 13% makes it a perfect apertief.
- 50 2018 Marsanne/Viognier – La Cabane Reserve – IGP Pays d'Oc 24.00
A fresh and aromatic wine with juicy fruit made from soft-pressed Marsanne & Viognier grapes. It is crisp but easy going and represents the best of modern French wine making
- 51 2019 Domaine Pey Blanc No 1 Rosé – Coteaux d'Aix-en-Provence 36.00
An attractive nose with white flowers and hints of exotic fruits leads to an elegant palate with red fruits and citrus flavours.

Germany and The Alsace

- 52 2018 Pinot Gris – Cuvée Rene, Dopff & Irion – Alsace 34.00
Ripe, juicy white with honeyed fruit, good weight and an attractive streak of fresh, lemony acidity. Alsace Pinot Gris is very different to that produced elsewhere, having more weight and flavour. This is what the Italians call Pinot Grigio but their style is much lighter.

53	2015	Wachenheimer Riesling Trocken, Dr Burklin-Wolf – Pfalz <i>Burklin-Wolf is one of the foremost producers of dry wines in Germany. Made from young vines in the grand cru Goldbachel vineyards. This is a lovely spicy wine with attractive pineapple and mango fruit flavours.</i>	40.00

54	2017	Grillo DOC – Kabrilla - Sardinia <i>All blossom and orange peel then a long, dry finish make this a fascinating wine which shows the Grillo grape's full potential. Some of the grapes come from the tiny island of Mozia with the majority coming from Sicily itself.</i>	28.00
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55	2018	Moscato di Noto DOC – Planeta Wines – Sicily <i>Made from 100% Moscato Bianco this is dry and beautifully perfumed, think wild flowers and jasmine. A good lively finish making a perfect aperitif or a fine match to most fish dishes. Good with smoked salmon sandwiches to.</i>	35.00
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56	2018	Gavi di Gavi – Ascheri – Piemonte <i>From the lower cool slopes of the Ligurian Alps the Cortese grapes make a crisp and refreshing white. Lemons and minerals on the nose followed by a fresh palate with medium body and no oak. Drink with fish or as an aperitif.</i>	35.00
